The Learning Street comes to Life!

In early 2018 the idea of the 'Learning Street' was first discussed when the building committee met with our architects to design and develop a comprehensive Master Plan for the school, looking ahead to the next 15 years at St Joseph's Tranmere. Five years later and we see today the result of the many hours of planning and preparation finally come together as our Reception and Year 1 students experience the Learning Street for the first time this term.

It was delightful to see the many happy faces of students and parents coming through the complex for the very first time. It was a very proud and joyful start to the term, especially for our new mid-year Reception students as they start their school journey.

The Learning Street has now provided our school with amazing contemporary learning spaces and the latest facilities - already we can see how effective the space is for both teachers and students as the classes become a very connected learning community.

We hope to complete the landscaping over the next few weeks and will then organise a time for families to come and visit the Street.

Thank you to all who have assisted with this second staged project. We would like to acknowledge and thank the State Government for their contribution of a \$1.6M grant to assist with this timely development.

Recently we completed the construction of our new Sports Shed and hope to move into this space over the next few weeks. This will finally centralise all our sporting equipment and complete our multi-sports development project. This will provide easy access to the equipment for all our Physical Education Lessons, training sessions and our sports academy coaching programs. This project has been funded by our wonderful P & F fundraising initiatives. A huge thank you to all who have contributed in any way - as you can see, when we work together we can achieve many great

things for our school.

Our next project will be the construction of the new Early Years Playspace including a new sand and water play space. More information soon.

Numeracy News

How important is Place Value?


In the words of Dr Angela Rogers "*Think of Place Value as the frame of a house- it holds everything else up*". A robust understanding of place value is essential for success with calculations with the 4 operations and in many other areas of mathematics.

Knowing how important place value is, we decided to focus on improving teaching and learning in Place Value this year at St Joseph's Tranmere. This journey started by connecting with Dr. Angela Rogers and signing all teachers up for her 'Numeracy Teachers Academy'.

Dr Angela Rogers has a PhD in Mathematics, with a particular focus on place value. She designed an assessment called the 'PVAT' which we are using in years 2-6 to inform our teaching and assess and track student growth in place value. We are also using the pre-PVAT assessment in the Early Years to ensure the relevant pre-requisites have been taught and understood.

The PVAT assessment tests children on the 6 aspects of place value:

Teachers have had professional development in teaching place value and on administering and analysing the PVAT. We are pleased to report that we have already seen growth between the PVAT data from the start of Semester 1 and the start of Semester 2. Teachers are now analysing the second lot of data to identify areas for future growth and enrichment.



Australian Mathematics Competition


On Tuesday the 6th August, some of our year three, four and five students participated in the Australian Mathematics Competition (AMC). The AMC contains unique problems designed to challenge and extend students' problem-solving skills. It was wonderful to provide this enrichment experience to some of our keen mathematicians.

This term, our Year 1s are focusing on fairytales and narrative writing in their literacy learning. This week, their learning has involved

students retelling the story of The Three Little Pigs. First, they co-constructed a story map with the help of their teachers. Then, students participated in some fun hands-on literacy rotations including Readers Theatre, stick puppets, sock puppets, and sequencing pictures from the story. All of these activities have helped our students to confidently retell the story and learn about the elements of a narrative text.



Debating

Every year, Year 5 and 6 students have the opportunity to join the Debating Squad. This year, we have 11 eager Debaters. The Blue team is comprised of April, Mary, Jack, Shaya, and Oliver H, and the Yellow Team, formed by Janis, Elaine, Karlia, Cathy, Abigail and Teegan. Teams meet twice a week for trainings, and debate every 3-4 weeks against other schools. The Debaters are committed to their craft and work hard in their teams each week. Some highlights of the season so far include; Yellow Team's round 1 win (followed up in round 3!), Shaya winning 'Speaker of the Night' on his very first debate, and Crazy Hair Round where students debated with wild and whacky hairstyles.

How to Volunteer in our School

Information for Volunteering - Due to changes in the Child Protection Act

At St Joseph's School Tranmere, we are always grateful for the support given by our volunteers. Volunteering applies to a wide range of activities in the school including attending excursions, coaching sports teams, reading in the classroom, helping in the many committees and many other school-related activities.

If you would like to act as a volunteer in the school, you are required to have a 6-point check. Please provide the school with copies of the following:

- Completed CESA Volunteer Registration pack available from the school office
- A Catholic Police Check Clearance or Working With Children Check (WWCC from the Department of Human Services (if you need to obtain this clearance please come to the school office)
- A RRHAN-EC (Responding to Harm, Abuse and Neglect in Education and Care) training Certificate
- Work Health and Safety on-line Induction for Volunteers Certificate
- Work Health and Safety signed form
- COVID Status Certification

Please note: that all these processes are mandatory and must be completed in order to volunteer/continue to volunteer. This requirement is designed to ensure our children are protected and safe at school.
